

Historic Preservation Board Minutes
City of Wauchula
April 8, 2010

The Wauchula Historic Preservation Board met Thursday, April 8, 2010 at 5:00 p.m. The following members were present: Preston, Hancock-Ackerly, Royal and Collins. Peavy was absent.

Preston called the meeting to order.

Royal made the motion, seconded by Hancock-Ackerly to approve the minutes from February 19, 2010. All were in favor. Motion carried.

The Board reviewed an application for a Certificate of Appropriateness to install signage and awnings on the building located at 116 – 120 W. Main Street. The awnings would be either green and white striped or green and gold striped and would be located on both the east and south sides of the building. The sign would be a flat metal sign affixed to the building, which is better than painting directly on the building. The awnings on the east side of the building are adjacent to an alley and will need to be designed so as to not create an obstruction. Minshe stated that the USF Representative she spoke with was aware that there was an alley there and they were planning on addressing that concern. Royal made the motion, seconded by Hancock-Ackerly to approve the Certificate of Appropriateness. All were in favor. Motion carried.

The Board discussed the vacancies on the Board. Many names were given to Minshe to follow up with to see if they were interested in sitting on the Board.
